Important Information

The Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) are conducting a joint study on the economic and social impact of open government for the Arab region. The study will reflect on literature review and previous studies and reports made by OECD and ESCWA and other organizations, and it will consider case studies and best practices from Arab and OECD countries. As such, and for the preparation of the study, this Sample Case Submission Form is intended to help the collection efforts for inspiring case studies and best practices from government entities and agencies in the Arab region. It should be noted that selected cases may be published within the ESCWA portal for the open government, which is under design and implementation, as well as the <u>OECD Open Government case platform</u>¹. Furthermore, the relevant experiences will be in featured in the planned Joint OECD-ECSWA meeting of the MENA Working Group on Open and Innovative Government this year, in coordination and collaboration with authorities concerned by these experiences.

The attached form serves as a submission form for open government activities that have been or are currently being developed and implemented at any level of government, and specifically those authorities that are working on open government development in the country, including local levels. The Case Study might cover one of the following topics: Open Government, Open Data, Stakeholder Participation, Collaboration, Citizen Engagement, Transparency, Accountability or Innovation in the Public Sector.

In the context of the attached form, an "activity" refers to any processes and actions taken to work towards the achievement of open government at national, area or local levels. An activity can consist of one or more actions. Participants can submit as many activities they wish, and it is preferable to choose activities with an economic or social impact. ESCWA will make the analysis of the contributions and may contact participants with follow-up questions.

The membership of Tunisia to the OGP initiative is considered one of the most tangible impacts of the revolution that Tunisia witnessed. Indeed, presenting this exceptional experience aims to highlight and valorize the multiples efforts made by stakeholders to strengthen the modalities of public governance. It also aims to expose the lessons learned and best practices adopted which enabled Tunisia to join this intentional network.

Overview of the project and issues to be resolved

After the revolution of 2011, Tunisia has witnessed a paradigm shift in the new vision of the post-revolution public administration and its relationship with its users.

Indeed, various factors have promoted the idea to move from the classic administration to an open administration. Among these factors, it can be mentioned the limited mechanisms for consultation and citizen participation, the existence of a large list of reforms required to lead this change, as well as the need to establish a framework for coordination and collaborative work between government and civil society. This post revolution period was characterized by the convergence of aspirations of government and civil society to adopt a common goal "Open Government" thanks to the heightened awareness of all stakeholders on the importance of this reform approach.

These aspirations of reforms have been consolidated by a set of measures already adopted, such as the integration of ICT in government work, the elaboration of a clear strategic government vision (anti-corruption strategy, action plan for the access to information, design of tax reform process since 2011, ...) In this context, the Tunisian government has expressed its aspirations to join this network.

Through this project, the Government and citizens will both benefit from the positive impacts and achievements carried out in this context

The main objectives of this membership process are :

- Consecrate the commitment and aspirations of the Tunisian government to establishing a new public governance model more transparent and more responsive to citizens' expectations and to claims of the people after the revolution of 2011
- Promoting transparency, accountability and combating corruption as well as further involving citizens through the use of Information and Communications Technology (ICT), thus improving citizens' quality of life and their relationship with the government.
- Take advantage of the opportunity to exchange experiences and best practises in fields of transparency, corruption fight; improvement of public services; citizen participation in public policies process and integration of ICT within the governmental actions

The envisioned measures for the future are articulated around :

- Maintain the membership of Tunisia within this international network
- Valorize and maintain the achievements completed under the OGP program and ensure the sustainability of the various projects carried out
- strengthen the collaborative framework and the co-creation process

2.7. What Makes Your Activity Different, Unique, or Innovative?

Despite the context and the political instability that Tunisia has witnessed since the revolution, It took advantage of the OGP initiative to instaure the open government principles wihin the government work. Indeed, the participatory approach and the co-creation process, in addition to the existence of an active and engaged civil society have made it possible to achieve various tangible results and reforms. Moreover, the PGO program has been designed to respond to the citizens' aspirations by implementing projects and reforms aimed at improving the citizens' life. Also, designing and implementing the different OGP action plans took into account the continuity and sustainability of the reforms undertaken.

- **Stakeholders**: Government (Ministries, local authorities) are the main stakeholders in the OGP program. In addition and NGOs have an important contribution in the success of the program implementation by providing the required support for commitments which are generally carried out within the framework of cooperation between the government and non-governmental actors and donors having an important contribution to support this process.
- **Users** : includes Government, citizens, CSOs and NGOs. Given that OGP program concerns all national and local stakeholders

Tunisia joined the OGP initiative on January 14, 2014. It has developed and implemented three action plans. Each action plan provided a framework for concerted government-civil society efforts across all action plan stages.

The Open Government Partnership program enabled the achievement of several reforms and initiatives in this area that have had a positive impact at the national and local levels. Thanks to these achievements, Tunisia improved in 2018 its rating and obtained 13 out of 16 points to maintain its membership in the OGP.

The OGP program has been concrtized by 03 OGP action plans comprising 48 commitments. It allowed completing tangible <u>legal, technical and organizational achievements</u>. That can be categorized as follow:

1. Enhancing transparency of government actions and public data release : by enshrining the

principles of "Open Gov" in the Constitution, adopting the Organic Law No.2016-22 on the right of access to information, establishing the access to information authority, consecrating several open data initiatives

- **2. Promoting integrity and combating corruption in the public sector** : through establishing a legal frameworks on reporting corruption, and on the disclosure of income and liabilities.
- **3.** Enhancing participatory approach and local governance : by the Constitutionalization of decentralization principles, the development of an open data platform for municipalities, developing an integrated electronic civil petitions system "e-people", developing an e-participation portal
- **4. Good Governance of national financial revenues and natural resources**: though developing an open data portal for the hydrocarbons and mining sectors in accordance with international standards , developing an open budget portal "Mizaniatouna"

Tools and measures aiming to assess the OGP program progress :

- <u>Periodic meetings of the steering committee</u> with the stakeholders involved in the implementation of the action plan
- Consecrate a <u>follow-up dashboard through the national OGP portal</u> to follow-up of the implementation of action plan
- Several assessment mechanisms provided by the OGP forum (self-assessment reporting, IRM)

4.2. Challenges

Several challenges have been encountered by Tunisia like :

- The fragile post-revolution context of Tunisia and political instability delayed the membership process of Tunisia. As well as the multiplicity of reforms required to satisfy the membership's conditions given political, economic and social challenges.
- Multiplicity of issues that Tunisia should to invest in and which are seen as aligned with the open government values such as transparency, accountability, integrity, citizen participation and use of ICTs. To accelerate this process, various preparatory works for more than two years have been achieved and enabled the implementation of several required reforms for Tunisia's membership, such as: publishing the state budget, preparing the citizens' budget, establishing the legal framework of access to the information, and developing a portal for public participation
- Organizational challenges and the change management represent a main issue to be resolved in order to accelerate the membership process. For that, an organizational framework in charge of the preparatory works aiming to join the initiative has been established through a steering committee at the level of the presidency of government. This committee brings together representatives of government departments and civil society working within a collaborative framework to prepare for the membership process of Tunisia to the OGP forum
- Weak human, material and financial resources devoted to the membership process, in addition to the weak of officials' expertise in this area. In this regard, several donors have provided a technical assistance to the Tunisian government in order to accelerate the membership process, such as the OECD which has prepared a study on open government situation in Tunisia. This study made it possible to identify the priority axes and reforms that the government must adopt.

4.3. Conditions for Success

The specificity of Tunisia's OGP experience is that it emanated from a common needs and aspirations between government and citizens aiming to reform and modernize the public governance system. This shared goal allowed designing a specific framework of coordination and cooperation between all national stakeholders, which could be considered as one of the most important success keys of this experience. Joining the OGP initiative, done on January 14, 2014, represents a confirmation of and explicit commitment by the Tunisian Government to the open government principles and its ongoing work to apply these principles within the framework of governmental and administrative action mechanisms.

At the practical level, since 2014, Tunisia has developed and implemented three national action plans. Each action plan provided a framework for concerted government-civil society efforts across all action plan stages, including its design, implementation, follow-up, and evaluation.

Besides, this program allows implementing several reforms and projects at the technological, institutional and legal levels.

These tangible achievements have contributed to improve the coordination and co-creation mechanisms and establishing an integrated ecosystem and dynamic for this program by extending the perimeter of stakeholders involved, standardizing the working and collaboration tools, in addition to the consolidation and valuation of efforts made in order to ensure the sustainability of the reforms undertaken.

Furthermore, the co-creation approach and the participatory approach to reform, which contributed to the success of Tunisia's OGP process which , has had palpable positive impacts, most notable of which is the increase in public interest in and awareness of the OGP process, commitments, and achievements. This has been confirmed through a survey undertaken by the e-Government unit at the Presidency of the Government. Moreover, social media platforms have played an important role in informing citizens, journalists, and various stakeholders on the OGP program news and developments in Tunisia.

Tunisia is considered as one of the first African countries members of the OGP initiative. This membership allowed to build an important potential, competencies and expertise in the open government field that enable Tunisia to support to other countries wishing to join this network.

At the national level, the government aims to instantiate the national OGP program and its philosophy at the local level through several initiatives to apply the OGP principles within municipalities and local authorities. Indeed, these aspirations are designed within the framework of the third OGP action plan which includes a project (commitment number 11) aiming to establish initiatives on open government at the level of twelve (12) municipalities, in a similar fashion to the OGP initiative launched at the national level, through adopting the same participatory approach.

4.5. Lessons Learned

What lessons from your experience would you like to share with others like you? Where there any pitfalls to avoid?

The specificity of the OGP initiative is that its foundation and its concretization is done by two partners, the government and the civil society, which must work in close concertation. This coordinative framework represents the key factor for the success of Tunisia's experience in this area given the establishment of a co-creation participation framework throughout this process. Besides, the leadership, the commitment of the government to implement change management and the involvement of official is a success key for the achievement of this action plan.

Also, the government's commitment and its desire to adopt the open government principles and to maintain its membership in this international network push all other stakeholders to support it through providing the required assistance. It could be mentioned, also, that the change management and the involvement of officials is a success key for the achievement of this action plan.

During the recent years, the OGP program allows government to achieve various reforms thanks to the rational approach adopted in the whole OGP action plans which are designed in accordance to the national visions and stratgies and aiming to prioritize the reforms to be implemented. the government aims, through this program to valorize and ensure the sustainability of completed reforms and projects, as well as building new reforms based on previous initiatives and further enrichment of current achievements.
